

SHAI MARCHES IN NEW YORK PERSIAN PARADE

On Sunday, April 22, 2018, SHAI marched in the New York Persian Parade following a banner with Jewish Menorah symbols. SHAI members marched down Madison Avenue, dancing to Persian music and proudly waving Persian Flags. After the parade, the No-Ruz festivities continued at Madison Square Park where SHAI mingled with the Iranian-American community.





SHAI SPONSORS FIRST-EVER NASSAU COUNTY NO-RUZ CELEBRATION

On the evening of March 21st, invited by Nassau County Legislator Ellen Birnbaum, over 150 Nassau County residents celebrated No-Ruz, the Persian New Year, at the Theodore Roosevelt Executive and Legislative Building in Mineola. The event included a Haft Seen No-Ruz Ceremonial table, a musical performance, and poetry readings. SHAI sponsored traditional No-Ruz refreshments including fresh and dried fruits, nuts, and pastries. This first-ever event in Nassau County acknowledges the importance of our Persian Jewish community to our elected officials and municipal governance.





SHAI HOSTS PANEL PRESENTATION ON SOCIAL MEDIA

Together with United Parent Teacher Council, SHAI convened its annual education forum on April 23. SHAI and UPTC have partnered for over a decade regarding subjects important to families with students of all ages and in all school settings. This year's event drew over 250 parents, adolescents, and children from public and private school who attended to learn about the serious ramifications of social media postings: In addition to the negative social emotional effects of students who are bullied and targeted on the internet, the panel also addressed the legal, academic, and employment consequences of improper social media posts, shares, and likes. These include: student suspensions, lost college admissions and scholarships, and lost jobs. The panelists included Superintendent of Great Neck Schools Dr. Teresa Prendergast, Psychologist Rena Gombo,



Provost Nancy Kaplan, ED.D., Police Detective Rory Forestal, and Supreme Court Justice Hon. John Iliou. A thought-provoking question and answer session followed the presentation.


SHAI SPONSORS HOLOCAUST FILM FOR FAMILIES



On Sunday, April 22, SHAI, in cooperation with the Museum of Jewish Heritage, the Gold Coast Arts Center, and the Holocaust Memorial & Tolerance Center of Nassau County, held the Long Island premiere of the HBO documentary film, *The Number on Great-Grandpa's Arm*. The film is an introduction to the Holocaust for the fourth generation of children, and focuses on the tender conversations between 10-year-old Elliot and his grandfather, a Holocaust survivor. The film's original artwork and drawings are very profound. This special family event was followed by a conversation with a Holocaust survivor. The Social Senior Center celebrated No-Ruz this year with a ceremonial Haft Seen table, singing, dancing, and food. They enjoyed the traditional No-Ruz meal of Polo Sabzi and fish served from Shiraz. 

Transplant Surgeon, a Rabbi, a Donor, a Recipient

Dr. Aaron Winnick is a transplant surgeon specializing in liver and kidney transplantation. He received his medical degree from UMDNJ - New Jersey Medical School (now known as Rutgers Medical School), and then went on to do his residency in General Surgery at SUNY Downstate Medical Center. He subsequently completed a fellowship in abdominal transplantation at NYU Langone Medical Center, where he worked as an attending for over 5 years. He started working at Northwell Health in 2017, where he is currently involved in starting up the liver transplant program.



Rabbi Howard Stecker became senior rabbi of Temple Israel of Great Neck in 2003 after serving the Jewish Community Center of West Hempstead and the Shelter Rock Jewish Center in Roslyn. He graduated Columbia University with a BA in English and was ordained from the Jewish Theological Seminary, He is an officer of the New York Board of Rabbis and a Senior Rabbinic Fellow of the Shalom Hartman Institute. He and his wife, Deanna, have three sons.
